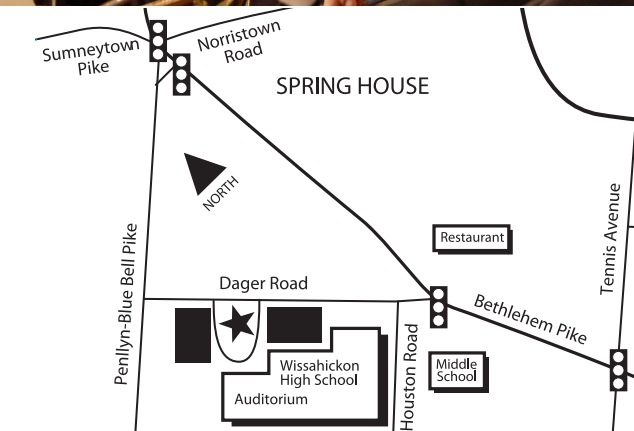

Critically acclaimed cellist Stephen Framil joins the orchestra to perform the cello concerto by Anton Dvorak, one of the cornerstones of the cello repertoire. Franz Schubert's haunting Fantasy in f minor was written as a piano duet, but was transcribed for orchestra several years after his death to allow larger audiences to hear this masterpiece. Concluding the concert will be the thrilling Pini di Roma, by Ottorino Respighi.
